HISTORY

BEN HUR SHRINERS INITIATION 1900

The average Shriner is a man, who like Jack of schoolboy days, likes to take a day off just for the pleasure of it. Whenever he sees an opportunity of taking this day off upon the occasion of the pilgrimage of some unfortunate across the hot sands of the desert, then indeed does he enjoy himself.

Yesterday and last night the members of Ben Hur Temple and a number of visiting Shriners from Dallas and Galveston had such an opportunity of enjoying themselves upon the occasion of the initiation of quite a number of persons into the mysteries of the Temple.

As a preliminary of the coming event there was a large street parade the local and visiting Shriners along with the "**victims**" of the evening's entertainment. The Shriners were all attired in their finest evening wear topped with the traditional red hats. The "victims" of the occasion in anticipation of the coming trials and tribulations were dressed in sack cloth and vainly tried to look "comfortable" while they rode diminutive and very sad looking donkeys in the wake of the long line of marching Shriners. Heading the list was H. Clausen of this city who was evidently the first victim on the list since there was a large rope secured around his body while the other end was held by the Captain of the Guard, C. M. Bartolomew.

The lengthy parade wound through the downtown area, around the Capitol and back down the Avenue to the Masonic Temple (Located then at W 7^{th} & Colorado). This concluded this phase of the program and the victims for the evening's entertainment were turned over to attendants to be groomed and the Shriners retired to their respective hotels to be in readiness for an early convening for the entertainment of the evening.

The fun in this line was opened at 8:00PM in the Masonic Building with only the chosen permitted to enter but to those who stood on the neighboring roof tops the suffering of the pilgrims in their wanderings across the hot sands was most heartrending. The sounds drifting out of the ceremony at intervals gave a good idea of what was going on within.

Upon conclusion of the initiation ceremonies all those in attendance repaired to the Driskill Hotel for an elegant banquet. The banquet was to commence at 11:00PM but due to the length of the initiation ceremony, it was a few minutes past midnight before all the nobles were seated. For the next two hours everyone enjoyed magnificent menu arranged by the Driskell Manger.

There were a number of toasts by such dignitaries as Lt. Governor Browning, Attorney General Tom Smith, Noble George Green of Dallas, State Representative Jasper Collins and Noble J E Farnsworth of Dallas. Goodbyes were said after 2:00AM to the sounds of the Besserer's Orchestra.


LEGION OF HONOR

Do you know these Veterans?

Noble Sam Stimson



I began my military duty in June, 1960. I took the oath in Charlotte, N.C. We had to wait for transportation so a group of us went to a small restaurant across the street. We were given vouchers for the meal and we thought we would get a nice Carolina BBQ plate. We all sat down, the waitress came over and we pulled out our vouchers. Before we could order, she turned and yelled to the kitchen, "5 Recruit Meals"! That pretty much set the tone for the next 5 weeks.

I managed to get through USAF Basic Training, which is pretty similar to a vacation in a motel 6, and then off to Aerial Photography School at Lowry AFB in Denver. This was 33 weeks of electronics and photography training and drinking 3.2 beer. On graduation day we all gathered in the hall and looked at the orders board. I was headed to France!

A long story short, I had planned to stay for 4 years, get out, go to college, graduate, and work with my Father. Funny how the best laid plans change. I loved my job and excitement. So I reenlisted.

Being involved with Tactical Reconnaissance means there are limited assignments, most of which are not in the United States. I found myself visiting France, England, South Carolina, Texas, Okinawa,

Thailand, Japan, and Vietnam (a few times). I got to where I could actually fall asleep on a C-130. As soon as the engines started I would doze off not wake up until we landed.

I met my wife Jeannette in Upper Heyford, England at a dance in the NCO Club. We were reassigned to Bergstrom, Austin in 1969. During that assignment I used the GI Bill to get my BA from Southwest Texas State.

Back and forth from Texas to England and back to Texas again and I retired an E8 on June 30, 1980. 20 years and 15 days that I would do all over again.




