§7.3 Finance Advisory Committee (optional). This temple may have a Finance Advisory Committee.

- (a) **Composition**. It shall consist of four at-large members of this temple. Two of the four at-large members are to be elected each year at the annual meeting for a term of two years.
 - (b) **Duties**. It shall:
 - (1) Analyze and make recommendations as to the financial affairs of the temple.
- (2) Examine the proposed major financial obligations and expenditures before such obligations or expenditures are incurred or made.
 - (3) Review all necessary current expenses.
- (4) Examine whether any officer, department, committee, organization, unit or individual having authority incurs expenditures that exceed the appropriations set out in the budget.
- **(5)** Examine the system under which the financial affairs of the temple, and every subordinate body thereof, are administered and make such recommendations from time to time as may be deemed for the good of the temple or any subordinate body thereof.
- **(6)** Review any bill for travel, hotel or entertainment expense of any officer or representative to determine if it is reasonable and necessary and within the budget.
- (7) Have access to all financial books, papers ad accounts of the officers and review them on a periodic basis, and recommend certified public accountants for examination and audit.
- (8) Review the financial institutions in which the funds of the temple are to be, or already are, deposited.
- **(9)** Investigate suitable investments and investment institutions for the funds of the temple.
- (10) Evaluate the proper coverage and limits of the bonds for the treasurer and recorder, and any other officers required to be bonded.
 - (c) **Reports**. This committee shall issue its findings, recommendations and reports to the board of directors of this temple.
 - (d) **Quorum**. Three members of this committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Article 7 Committees

 - (2) Examine the proposed major financial obligations and expenditures before such obligations or expenditures are incurred or made.
 - (3) Review all necessary current expenses.
 - (4) Examine whether any officer, department, committee, organization, unit, or individual having authority incurs expenditures that exceed the appropriations set forth in their respective budget.
 - (5) Examine the system under which the financial affairs of the temple and every subordinate body thereof are administered and make such recommendations from time to time as may be deemed for the good of the temple or any subordinate body thereof.

The findings, recommendations, and reports shall be provided in written form and become a part of the minutes of the respective meetings.

HISTORY

500 ZOR SHRINERS ASSEMBLE AS 52 ARE INITIATED IN CEREMONIAL 1937

Zor Shriners, about 500 strong, from all parts of Wisconsin gathered here in Madison yesterday to initiate 52 candidates into the Shrine amid the pomp and circumstance of the order. It was the 10th ceremonial for Zor which came into being in 1932.

The initiation ceremonies at the Masonic Temple took place in the afternoon preceded by a parade around the capitol square and snappy close order drill in front of the temple on Wisconsin Ave. In the evening the Shriners, both old and new, sat around the banquet board in the lavish Loraine Hotel's Crystal Ballroom for dinner and festivities.

With yesterday's initiation, Charles Netherwood of Oregon, a mason for many years became the oldest Shriner in the US. Mr. Netherwood, a mason for many years, is 95 years young.

Hundreds of Saturday afternoon shoppers watched from the sidewalks and store windows of capitol square as the parade passed. New to Zor was the La Crosse Oriental Band which marched to the weird exotic strains of "Sultan Sam". This was the premiere performance of the La Crosse band which was only organized less than two weeks ago. Garbed in the flowing garments of the Arab, the band is composed entirely of drums and the whining Chinese Musette, which emits the strains of music which have so long charmed the Cobra.

The fez hatted Shriners marched two abreast carrying canes. Shriners observing but not participating in the parade were plucked from their positions of observation by the wrecking crew and hauled to the temple in the Police Paddy Wagon, loaned to Zor for the occasion, to be released after paying a fine.

The Madison Zor Band, clad in black and gold-braided jacket and trousers played marching tunes. The Zor Arab Patrol stepped lively to the rousing march tunes. And last were the shrine camels Zor, Dana and Sheba guided by the Camel Patrol. It was their first appearance since their leader Rufus died.

The banquet concluded the ceremonials. A professional stage show consisting of twenty acts provided entertainment for the attendees.

ONCE AGAIN IN TRANSYLVANIA

November is a time to remember and be grateful. Remember that we owe our freedom to those who served our great country. Be thankful for family and friends and for the blessings we enjoy. This month's story is about gratefulness. As usual, it is a true story; this time, it is about my mother.

She grew up in the Transylvanian mountain village you've read about in previous stories. She is the oldest of three children, a small family for that time and area. Most families had at least seven children. The farm needed workers, and children didn't get paid a wage. From an early age, she enjoyed reading and learning. She has a large collection of books, mostly cheap romance novels by Danielle Steel, Sandra Brown, etc. She draws the line at that Meyer hack and her hogwash.

As children, my siblings and I spent our summers in the mountains while my parents remained in the city. Aside from enjoying the quiet, they were busy extending their education. Both my parents have multiple doctorates, which is no small feat.

But it could all have been dramatically different. And that's where this month's story comes in.

My mother's parents had a fourth-grade education. I think I have seen my grandfather write his name only once, and it took him a while to remember how to write it. There was not much need for writing on the farm. My grandmother could read well and do basic arithmetic, but that's about it. Although they wanted their children to get an education, they needed lots of help on the farm. After my mother finished fourth grade, her parents did not enroll her in fifth grade. When school started in September, she was sent to mind the sheep and the cows instead of returning to school. She told me she was out on the pasture crying because her friends were learning new things in school, and she was not.

November 2024

A simple visit from a schoolteacher changed her life and, consequently, mine. The village teacher knew my mother and her family and was surprised when my mother did not return to school. She decided to visit my grandparents and find out what happened. My grandparents told her my mother was old enough to mind the herd and the flock. They couldn't spare her for such silly things like getting an education. The teacher insisted that my mother was an excellent student and should return to school to finish at least eighth grade. Reluctantly, my grandparents agreed. My mother went back to school and completed eighth grade. Then, she went to high school, followed by college. So did her brother and sister. All because of this simple visit from a teacher in that small mountain village.

From an early age, my parents told me and my siblings that education is one of the most essential things in life. It is something that nobody can take from you. My brother already had an engineering degree when he came to the United States. However, employers told him his education needed to be improved to get an engineering job here. He earned another engineering degree here. My sister has a master's degree, which was encouraged by her husband, who also has a master's degree. My engineering degree is from Iowa State. All because of a visit from a village teacher. All of us are immensely grateful to her!

Sometimes, the most minor acts can have the most significant

consequences. Think and act carefully.
