


As a tribute to Ill Sir Gene Sanders, his son Mike rides his dad's trike at the TSA Ceremonial in San Angelo.

# Eighty Years Ago, Ben Hur Shriners Were Selling War Bonds

# D Day June 1944

After the D Day landing in Normandy and the other beaches Ben Hur Shriners have elected to observe Shrine Day by selling war bonds according to the Illustrious Potentate John Gainer. All the Temple's nobility were requested to meet at the Shrine's central booth at 9:30am at 7<sup>th</sup> and Congress Avenue to receive their instructions. All nobles were instructed to wear their Shrine fezes.

In all Ben Hur Shriners will be staffing six booths in downtown Austin during the day with a bond rally to be held at 7<sup>th</sup> and Congress Avenue at 10:00am. Three musical organizations will be participating and Pat Adelman of KTBC (*that was a radio station back then*) will be presiding as master of ceremonies using a public address system.

Art Sprinkle is general chairman of the Shrine Day program. The Wednesday rally will be followed by the "Bonds a Poppin" war bond show at the drive in theatre on the Dallas Hwy from 8:00pm to midnight. Many features for the event have been lined up including a musical battle between the Bergstrom Field Orchestra and the San Marcos Airfield Orchestra. There will also be an auction of various items sent her by Hollywood Celebrities and others. Also novelty acts combined with technicolor cartoons from four major studios.

Tickets to the show from the Yank Drive-In theater or by call the number for the event office.

The City of Austin purchased \$1,000,000 in war bonds to spur along Travis County participation in the drive. This purchase and other large purchases that had been cleared through the Federal Reserve Bank in Dallas swelled the total sales to \$1,454,301.25 and brought the overall county total to \$4,759,486. Other large contributors were First Federal Savings and Loan, The Mutual Deposit and Loan Company, Missouri Pacific Railroad and the Southern Pacific Railroad.

Editor Note: D Day marked the beginning of the end to WW2. The lives of many service men were lost on that day. Today the Ben Hur Legion of Honor carries on the tradition of keeping the memory of those lost souls alive along with all service men lost in the protection of the American way of life.

# MEANWHILE, BACK IN TRANSYLVANIA

Ladies and Nobles,

Yes, this is a new story. No, you are not dreaming. Yes, there may be more stories in the future. No, unfortunately I cannot promise you a regular publishing schedule. Enjoy this month's story!

Late fall in the Transylvanian mountain village is usually cold. The sun shines, but the locals say it has teeth because instead of feeling the heat you feel the sharp bite of winter that is just a few weeks away. By now all the harvest is safely stored away for the winter. The hay is packed in the attic over the barn. The grains are stored in thick sacks guarded by an array of mouse traps. Dried vegetables are hanging in woven sacks in the pantry, waiting for the time when they are rehydrated into delicious soup. Sliced fruit is fermenting inside oak barrels, on its way to becoming moonshine.

There are just a few tasks left on the farm before the snow blankets everything and nature lays down for a long winter nap. One of these tasks is to gather all the dead branches, twigs, dead bean and corn stalks, and other assorted plant residue that doesn't serve a purpose on the farm. These are all gathered into one big pile, usually about ten feet tall, in the middle of the now empty corn field and away from anything that might catch fire. We kids weren't fond of roaming all over the farm to gather it all, but thoroughly enjoyed the fire that followed once everything was into one pile. I am convinced there is a bit of a pyromaniac in all of us.

The fire usually happens after dark, and grandma would prepare for us slabs of thick cut bacon, with the rind still on but cut through to allow roasting over an open flame. We kids found sticks to use for this purpose and impaled the slab of bacon rind first. Once the bacon gets warm, grease starts to ooze down the slab of bacon and into the fire. We used slices of sourdough bread to catch these droppings. If you've never had slab bacon roasted over an open flame and sandwiched between slices of sourdough bread, I highly recommend you try it at least once. As a side, you can have tomatoes with a little bit of salt or red onions sliced thin with a bit of salt, paprika and vinegar. I'm not fond of vinegar (or broccoli) so I find lemon or lime juice a lot more pleasant.

One year grandpa had to replace many pickets in the fence, so the burn pile was particularly tall. We kids were really looking forward to the big fire. We had the sticks, bacon, bread, and sides ready to go. We were just waiting for the sun to go down so we could start the fun.

Shortly before sundown, our great uncle came over to see grandma, his sister. We kids were too distracted by the impeding bacon roast to pay any attention to him. After a while, it got dark outside, and he got ready to leave. His house was a good half an hour walk from our farmhouse, but in the same direction as the corn field. We got our stuff and started our walk towards the burn pile.

The corn field was hidden from view by a small hill and as we walked around it, we saw the faint glow of embers and smelled smoke. We were all disappointed and outraged. Our great uncle was visibly confused by our reaction but confessed to lighting up the burn pile on his way to visit his sister, which was hours ago. He had heard on the radio that it was going to rain the next day, so he thought he was helping. There wasn't enough fire to roast anything, let alone a few slabs of bacon.

We judge others by their actions and ourselves by our intentions. The moral of this story is that being helpful when not asked can sometimes hurt more than it helps. Grandpa built a small fire for us back at the farmhouse and we got our treat anyway. And the great uncle became even less popular than he already was. May God rest his soul because we know he had good intentions.
